A Few Facts about UCC ARTICLE 1, GENERAL PROVISIONS

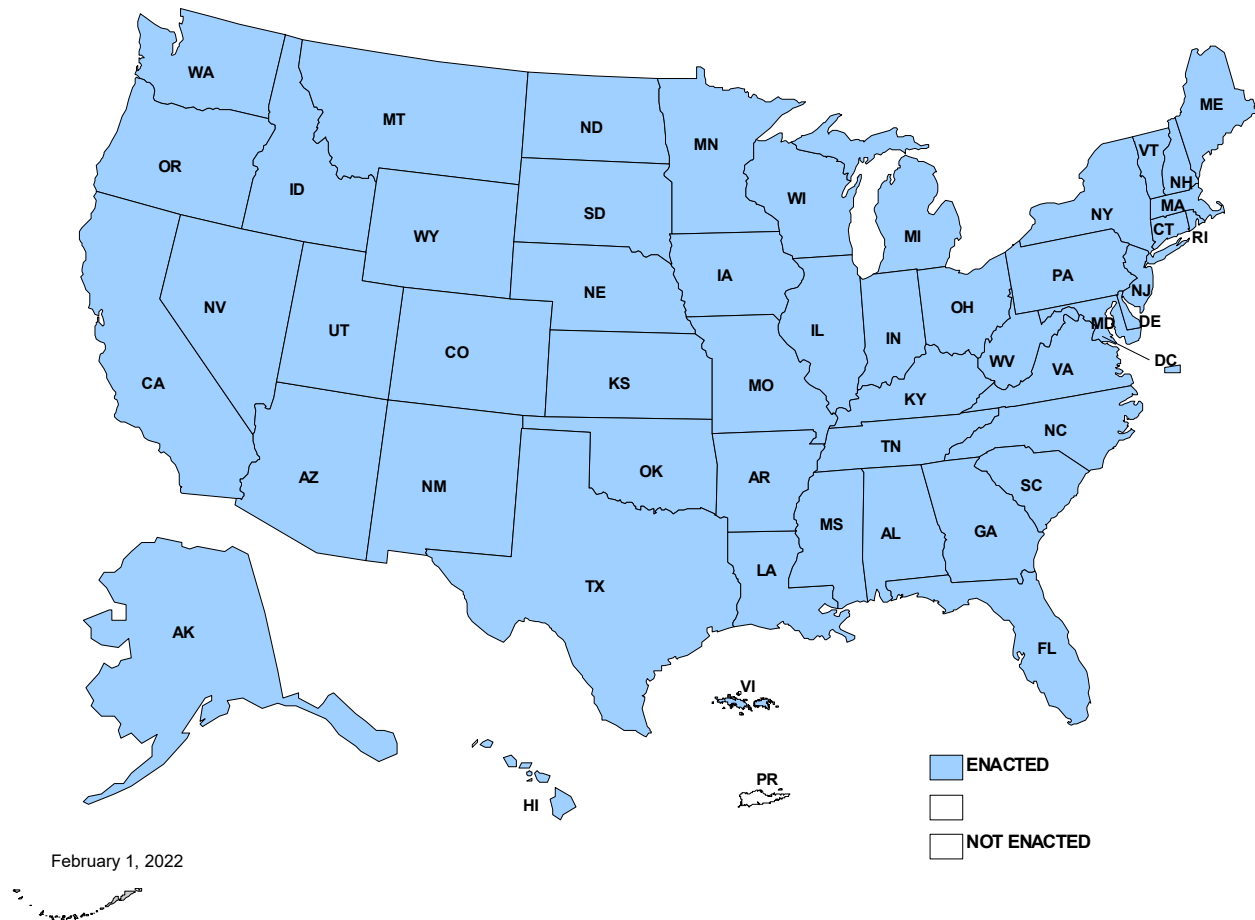
PURPOSE: UCC Article 1, the general provisions section of the UCC, has been amended to harmonize with ongoing UCC projects and revisions.
