Steve, here are some technical issues I saw with this draft you may want them to fix before the annual meeting:

Comment, page 1, line 43 – delete the “a” before “years”

1. Legislative Note, p. 5 – we have been including a sentence here that would say basically “do this everywhere the bracketed term appears in the rest of the act” or something like that. The new rule doesn’t actually dictate the language but you might want to have them insert something there.
2. Page 6, line 3 - delete the space after “[act]”
3. Page 10, line 1 – delete the space after “than”
4. Page 12 – need a legislative note for subsection (c)
5. Page 12 – legislative note on lines 20&21 – it seems odd the way it is presented. Shouldn’t it be written in the affirmative – that is, “a state should adopt this language if...” rather than in the negative? I don’t think the manual addresses this issue but I think that’s how we usually style these.
6. Page 17, line 6 – delete the closed bracket after “[act],” unless I missed the open bracket for this language, which is entirely possible
7. Page 17, line 9 – bracket the “or”
8. Page 17, line 10 – bracket the semicolon (I think)
9. Page 17, legislative note – there is no bracketed language in paragraph (3) other than the word “guardian” which was taken care of earlier in the draft; also, in line 15, replace “they” with “the state” and put an “s” at the end of “include”

I have a couple of other things I might bring up at Monday’s session that are not style related, but I won’t bother with the above.
