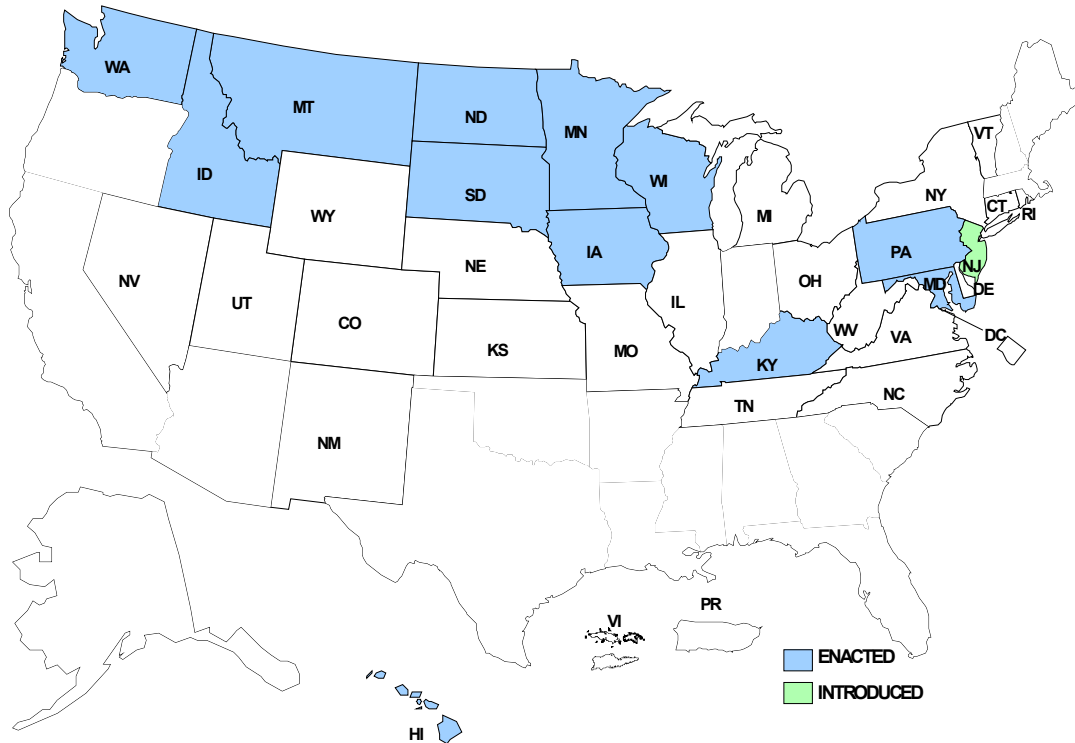




A Few Facts about
THE REVISED UNIFORM LAW ON NOTARIAL ACTS (2018)

- PURPOSE:** Traditionally, an individual has been required to physically appear before a notary public. In recent years, technology and commercially available identification services have made it possible to perform notarial acts for persons who are not in the physical presence of a notary public. RULONA (2018) authorizes a notary public to perform notarial acts for remotely located individuals using communication and identity-proofing technology provided its requirements have been fulfilled.
- ORIGIN:** Completed by the Uniform Law Commission in 2018.
- APPROVED BY:** American Bar Association
- ENACTED BY:** Hawaii, Idaho, Iowa, Kentucky, Maryland, Minnesota, Montana, North Dakota, Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Washington, and Wisconsin.
